Shelter for Abused Women— Steve LeBlanc announced that we will be holding a food drive to benefit the Shelter for Abused Women. Their food pantry is empty.

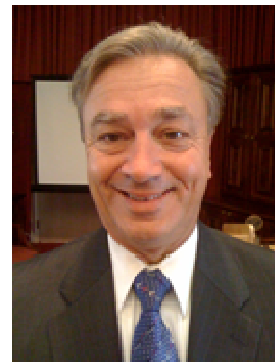
